Sunday School on February 5 "Our Origins and the Early

Years": Mark your calendars and plan to attend this first session in a series of Sunday School classes that will retell the story of New Holland Mennonite Church (NHMC). On this first Sunday, Darvin Martin (who wrote the 75th-anniversary historical account of NHCM, "A People on the Way") will be with us to recapture our origins in Europe and migration to the Groffdale and Weaverland Valleys of Lancaster County in the 1700s. Brenda Hurst will share about the broader Mennonite stirrings in the US in the late 1890s to 1910s, which created the Weaverland Missions Committee who envisioned a church in New Holland. Steven Lantz will present about the moving of families into the New Holland Borough and the early formation and activities of this congregation. Come and engage with our church story!

This will be just the first of a series of sessions planned for the first Sunday of every month this spring and fall (March 5, April 2, May 7, Sept 3, Oct 1 and Nov. 5) to capture the interesting 100 - year history of New Holland Mennonite Church. This year of focus on our history will culminate in a **Centennial Celebration** on Covenant Sunday, November 19, 2023.

Lent Worship Services, beginning February 25: Theme: The Kingdom of God: Throughout Jesus' ministry, he teaches his disciples about the kingdom of God. Through a series of parables and lessons, the followers of Jesus begin to grasp "God's way," which is often different than what we might expect. As we learn more about the kingdom, we discover that we are called to embody these kingdom values now, as we await the full coming of God's kingdom in the future.
