I hear people talking about notes of encouragement that they received. The greeters and ushers met in a productive meeting from which new ideas and changes were implemented. Seventeen folks gathered in each others homes for "Guess Who's Coming to Dinner." Eleven people agreed to be on call in the nursery on Sunday mornings if needed. Each Sunday a different person is sharing a testimony from their own life. This week a group gathered and worked together to knot comforters for Nepal. The list could go on!

As a Leadership Team we are also paying attention to those areas that are no longer serving us well. We have reorganized our church structure to better serve our current size. We are questioning the amount of staff time and energy that the monthly newsletter requires. The Leadership Team is proposing that this be the last newsletter to be published. LT HIGHLIGHTS

Financial Update – There is a \$4,600 deficit currently in the budget. Some is due to timing of certain payments but most also is a result of the planned deficit. There will be a note in the bulletin to encourage continued giving. The LT also discussed using the money in the building and capital funds towards paving, flooring in the fellowship hall, and updating the library.

Congregational Next Steps – Dawn suggested three areas for work: learn to know each other better; learn to know about our community; and fast and pray. There was agreement that there is a lot more personal responsibility in renewing our church rather than letting it up to someone else. In the fall, both the Men's class and the Generations class will be working with materials around these themes. Some other suggestions were to meet together in a monthly combined Sunday School to share life stories or meaningful scriptures. These ideas will be continued topics at upcoming LT meetings.

Safe Church Update – Bryan Hower and Peg Jackson went to their first meeting held by Lancaster Conference on how to update our church's protection policy. They would like to have a fall and a spring meeting during the Sunday School hour to go over general information about the process. Jenn Esbenshade has agreed to assist them in their work.

Visitation Ministry – Members of the LT will be visiting those living in retirement communities who no longer attend NHMC to ask if they still consider NHMC their church or do they see their chaplain at their home to be their pastor. The LT agreed that Dawn's time should be focused more on the ELC and reaching out to the community. The Special Pals program will continue to support these residents.

Drone Vigil – Charles Longenecker sent an informational email to Dawn about vigils held at Horsham Airbase with the Lancaster 1040 for Peace Committee. The email is looking for churches to hold a worship service at the airbase. Dawn sees the first step as educating the congregation on the issue of drones. Dawn will ask the pastor from Pilgrim's Mennonite, who is leading these vigils, to come and preach on this issue.
