

Longest Night Service, Monday, December 21, 7 p.m. There's an Advent tradition within Western Christianity of inviting people to come together for the Longest Night, a night around the time of the winter solstice, when there are more hours of darkness than light. It's a time to come together for prayers and laments, to mourn the losses and griefs of the year, to let the tears flow for the hurting places in our own lives, as well as for our country and our world. Known also as "Blue Christmas," a Longest Night Gathering is a safe and sacred space to share anguish, to plead with God to remember us, to pray for justice and restoration, even to hope against hope, through our doubts and tears and fears, that "God will set things right all over the earth."

Christmas Eve Service, December 24: Outdoors (weather permitting), 5 p.m. A service of singing carols and scripture reading.

Movie and Chat: Friday, January 22, 7 p.m. Bring your popcorn to watch "White Savior: Racism in the American Church" on your computer through zoom (consider hooking it up to your TV). About "White Savior": Despite the progress many see in the US over the years, it's become increasingly clear that the deep roots of racism and white supremacy continue to run through our political, cultural, and religious institutions. White Savior explores the historic relationship between racism and American Christianity, the ongoing segregation of the church in the US, and the complexities of racial reconciliation.
