

SEPTEMBER Fundraiser for the ELC Kitchen: The Early Learning Center is in full swing raising money to upgrade the kitchen. The total cost of the project is \$145,000. Please consider giving toward this project through the church offerings in September. A \$3,500 matching grant is available from Everence. **Can we raise more than \$15,000?** (Clark Foundation has given \$50,000 to the ELC in a matching grant. So, the money we raise as a congregation will be matched again!)

When do we go back to church in the sanctuary? The Leadership Team is using the following to guide us in the future: We believe that we are the body of Christ together, therefore: 1) we will not meet together for worship in the sanctuary before the end of 2020 (perhaps longer); and 2) We will take our cues from retirement homes. An outdoor worship service is being planned at 4 p.m. on October 4 instead of morning worship.
